 - o Criteria: 16 years or younger, lives in U.S., facing a health-related challenge, has a commercial insurance plan that covers only a portion or none of the necessary treatment or equipment, and parent meets the following adjusted gross income levels (based on last year's 1040):

- o Provides wheelchair lifts for home and vans, ramping, specialty seating, bathing equipment, toileting equipment, therapy bikes, strollers, and much more to the medically fragile children of Georgia. Help fill the "insurance gap" between what is deemed medically necessary for a medically fragile child and what is actually covered by private insurance or Medicaid. Has a Healthcare Grant Program, which provides items such as sanitary items, specialized car seats, communication aids, toileting and bathing systems, ramps, van lifts, stair lifts, ceiling lifts and house ramps for families to keep. Other items, such as wheelchairs, adaptive strollers, positioning chairs, standers, gait trainers, therapy benches, and therapeutic bikes are provided to families to borrow equipment for a total of 24 months. The Loan Program is especially helpful for young children who will likely outgrow equipment within a short period of time. After 12 months of borrowing equipment, the family must provide a new Letter of Medical necessity from their therapist indicating the equipment is still appropriately sized and meeting therapeutic goals. A family may receive one (1) Healthcare Grant item and one (1) Loaned Equipment item per year. Applications and document criteria can be found online.
- O Criteria: The equipment must be deemed medically necessary to meet rehabilitation and quality-of-life goals, and applications must include a Letter of Medical Necessity from a licensed therapist.
